AGELESS AWARD LUNCHEON

With over 300 people in attendance, JFRF raised funds for their programs that support vulnerable elders in Oregon and beyond. Governor Barbara Roberts and Bill Schonely (pictured above) were honored as the 2016 recipients. The Ageless Award is given each year to individuals who are 75 years or older and who continue to make significant contributions to society: as volunteers, philanthropists, mentors and civic leaders. Over \$105,000 was raised.



GOLF TOURNAMENT

For the 5th year in a row, JFRF's incredible volunteer base in North Carolina raised funds to support indigent elders across Nicaragua. Nearly \$80,000 was raised.

TIES THAT BIND

This program is for the benefit of kinship caregivers (usually grandparents) who unexpectedly find themselves in the primary role of parent raising grandchildren. JFRF's goal for Ties That Bind is to strengthen the ability of these kinship caregivers to address their unique needs in order to improve outcomes for the at-risk children that they are raising, as well as for themselves.

Ties That Bind officially launched in January 2016 with a series of school-based support sessions in Portland, Oregon. The program is designed to provide unique peer support, consult and training, with the goal to improve timely access and clarity to resources available to families. Our program exists to create a sustainable model of volunteer-based peer mentors whose knowledge and experience are highlighted to assist newer grandparents in their communities and families.



VIDEO TRAINING PROJECT

JFRF has developed a training video library featuring basic caregiving skills for direct caregivers and household workers reflecting best practices in elder care. Many layperson caregivers have not had formal skills training, and demonstration through short videos has the ability to reach a large audience. Further, this program has been specifically designed for Spanish-speaking adult learners at any educational level. Training videos are coupled with master trainer and competency testing to confirm caregiver ability to complete care tasks correctly. An initial group of videos has been piloted and tested.

ADMINISTRATOR TRAINING PROJECT

JFRF held administrator training programs in 2016 for professionals who oversee programs serving older adults in Nicaragua. Taking place in our National Training Center in Jinotepe, training topics included financial and personnel management, fundraising tactics, operations and more.

A SPECIAL HONOR

JFRF founder, Keren Brown Wilson, and Michael DeShane, were honored by Portland State University with the prestigious Simon Benson Award for Philanthropy for their dedication to helping people with limited means age with dignity. Of the many notable speakers at the 17th annual awards dinner was Oregon Governor, Kate Brown.



UNIVERSITY-BASED PROGRAMS

JFRF has partnered with universities for 14 years with their university-based service-learning and interprofessional fieldwork programs. These programs engage students in community partnerships that allow them to combine academic theory with practical experiences. These experiences allow students to develop competencies needed to work with diverse patient populations throughout their professional careers in Oregon and beyond. JFRF hopes that this direct work with elders will encourage students to continue to give back to this vulnerable population, potentially through careers based in gerontology, geriatric care or intergenerational programming.

In 2016, students provided valuable medical attention, training and information to the public across Nicaragua, building capacity and supporting those caring for elders.
